Read, Read, and Read some more!





social/emotional environment where the children work and learn every day. A key aspect of this is the selection of intriguing and developmentally appropriate learning activities to meet the needs and interests of each child in his classroom.

Lessons are taught to small groups of children at one time and are typically brief and very clear presentations. The goal is to give students just enough to capture their attention and spark their interest. This allows them to be productive, independent learners as they transition to independent work choosing the learning materials best suited for them.

Because the UE teachers normally work with each child for two or three years, Bill, Shandra and Jim will get to know students' strengths and weaknesses, interests, and personalities extremely well. This enables them to use that knowledge to enrich the curriculum and provide alternate avenues for accomplishment and success. Following a three-year master plan, the UE team will monitor individual progress and keep parents informed with progress reports.

Q: Why do Montessori classes group different ages together?



Montessori programs are designed to address the developmental characteristics normal to children at each age level. Classes are organized to encompass a 2-3 year age span, allowing younger students to be mentored by older children, who in turn benefit from serving as role models. With 2/3 of the class returning each year, the classroom culture remains quite stable and the teacher does not have to be the primary focus. Because each child learns at his own pace, students can always find peers who are working at their current level. Students develop a strong sense of community with their classmates and teachers, and gifted children benefit from the stimulation of intellectual peers without requiring that they skip a grade or feel emotionally out of place.
