That being said, we are going to make the next few weeks of learning as enjoyable, enriching, rigorous and fun, yes fun, as possible!

Upper Elementary began online on Wednesday, August 5th, which was a half day. We are dedicated to making sure our students achieve their full academic potential and we don't want to miss any of the precious time that we have with them. Every student will be expected to log in to Google Classroom each morning for daily attendance by 8:30am. We have Chromebooks available for any student that will need one this year, so that will hopefully solve some technology issues we encountered last quarter. We covered many more details at our virtual Back to School parent night on Tuesday, August 4th at 5:00pm, so let us know if you have more questions.

The UE distance learning program will incorporate several types of technology this year. We will continue to have literature study groups on Zoom with small groups of

COVID-19 Update

Dear Students, Parents and Staff,

The operations team and our Governing Council are working together to navigate the safest possible outcome for reopening our school with our COVID-19 Plan B or C scenarios. The Arizona Department of Health Services (ADHS) released public health benchmarks last week that provide our school communities much-needed clarity on schools' safe reopening. The benchmarks align with three of the learning scenarios outlined in the Roadmap for Reopening Schools to help school leaders, educators, students and families understand how the metrics should influence school reopening decisions. Kathy Hoffman, MS, CCC-SLP, Superintendent of Public Instruction has shared, "While it's clear that Arizona is not currently ready to resume in-person or hybrid learning, we now have clear goals for knowing when it is safer to return to the classroom. I urge all school leaders to use these benchmarks to make safe decisions about learning this school year." These benchmarks and thresholds indicate which scenario should be in place based on the spread of COVID19. Families may choose to stay on our Distance Learning Plan for the entire school year. Please contact your Principal Educator if you are interested in this option.

Sedona Charter Governing Council approved the continuance of Distance Learning in all classrooms until the end of the first quarter of the 2020-2021 school year when this decision will be reassessed. This decision was made based on guidance from the AZ Department of Education and the AZ Department of Health, comparing benchmarks for safely opening schools to the local data. As a reminder, we are currently implementing "Plan C" of our Three Part COVID-19 Plan and will continue this until at least the end of the first quarter. In addition, as is required in one of Governor Ducey's executive orders, we are providing a safe, supervised work space on and off our campus for students who are at risk or who have special needs for school resources. First, Second and Third years who are at

risk at and/or who have special needs may attend Precious Stones or Sedona Creative Childcare Club from 8:30am -12:00pm Monday through Friday. Fourth through Eighth years can utilize our lunch patio with a hired supervisor from 8:30am to 12:00pm. Parents will need to sign up for these supervised safe spaces no later than the Friday before the week they are requesting this service. Please contact your Principal Educator to sign up for the

Engaging in Strings

Despite having to start this year's music instruction on line, our Strings Department is committed to providing students with a robust and engaging musical learning environment. There will be challenges for which we must adapt and work together for the sake of our budding musicians. Kristina will create a schedule of weekly classes for students using virtual platforms like Google Classroom, SmartMusic software and Zoom lessons to provide instruction, track assignments and assess each student. Additional software may be added as we progress through our virtual musical adventure!

Your child will have greater success learning his/her instrument virtually with access to the right equipment. Please consider making the following investments in your child's musical education:

- High quality headphones or speakers (preferably headphones) will translate pitch and tone quality better.
- Assure the microphone in your computer is working well or consider investing in a high. quality external microphone that will hook into your computer. Use advanced audio features
- A sizeable computer screen will help students see the physical intricacies of instrument instruction that will be required of them.
- Easy access to a printer to print sheet music and other music notation assignments. Students who have been studying with Kristina in past years will begin their curriculum first, followed by the plethora of beginners who are new to SCS this year. Parent participation will be vital to getting the beginners on their instruments and playing (particularly our youngest musicians in LE).

Some challenges we face include distributing instruments, sizing and tuning instruments. Kristina will be working on a system to address these needs, so it is vital that parents are reading emails and attending all scheduled parent Zoom Meetings.

Vicki cannot wait to work with our students and collaborate with each of the classrooms. She also has a love of gardening and has already helped to oversee and


implement the various changes and improvements to our garden. In her time spent outside of school, Vicki enjoys gardening, sewing, spending time with her dog, and playing board games with her friends.
